The health, welfare and safety of the community is threatened by the flood waters



Decontamination

- Required after every call
- All Lifeguards involved must get a “rinse off” from an Engine
- All exposed gear must be thoroughly scrubbed
- All team members receive vaccinations and other treatment as required
- Attempts are made to limit the exposure but follow up treatment is required in submersions etc...
- Team members have been very sick with a variety of ailments after rescues in TJ River area

Alert stages

- ONE
- TWO
- THREE
- Determines level of response and/or deployment of resources
- Entire county responds as ALERT stages



River Team Staged in TJ River Valley



- One emergency vehicle
- Three team members
- Specialized gear
- Contact with BORSTAR
- Housed in vehicle or at Fire station
- First Unit Deployed and last Unit released

Wrap up

- River Rescues are the most dangerous types that public safety workers encounter
- It is a very specialized skill that is perishable
- Requires special gear
- Requires frequent Area Familiarization to identify hazards and plan for emergencies
- Tijuana River valley is dangerous
- Rural
- Environmental
- Trash
- Sewage
- Number of victims
- Constant development challenges
- Access

Final Thoughts

- The new fence that extends out into the Pacific Ocean brings challenges to the people attempting to cross as well as to the Rescuers.
- Many drownings over the years in that area due to Rip Currents, structures and treacherous conditions
- The Dairy Mart Bridge has improved access to the people on the south side of the river and west of Smuggler's canyon etc...
- With new facilities and increased Federal workers there is a chance that they could get trapped during a flood event
- Disaster plans if not already in place would be highly recommended
