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

LEVEE CERTIFICATION & ACCREDITATION

- ▣ Levee Certification
 - Freeboard
 - ▣ Three foot minimum
 - ▣ Additional foot within 100 ft. either side of structures (such as bridges) or wherever flows are constricted. Additional half foot at upstream end of the levee
 - Closures
 - Embankment Protection
 - Embankment & Foundation Stability
 - Settlement
 - Interior Drainage

LEVEE CERTIFICATION & ACCREDITATION (continued)

- ▣ Levee Accreditation
 - Once all levee certification documentation has been reviewed & accepted by FEMA Levee Accreditation is complete.
 - If the levee certification is not completed the levee will be discredited.
