## **CILA SUSPENDS PBCILA PUMP STATION OPERATIONS**

The United States, International Boundary and Water Commission (USIBWC) reports the following regarding the South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant (SBIWTP) in San Diego, California:

Due to rain fall in the region, Comisión Internacional de Límites y Aguas (CILA) advises PBCILA pumping operations were suspended at about 2:50 am PDT today to protect equipment. Operations will resume as soon as water runoff in the Tijuana River decrease.

The Tijuana River is estimated to be flowing at 64 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) as of 12pm PDT which will fluctuate and peak above 190 MGD during this rain event.

We continue to treat up to 35 MGD at the South Bay wastewater treatment plant. There are no impacts to the South Bay Plant associated with this weather system.

The USIBWC continues to work closely with Mexican water authorities, and we will share more information if it becomes available.
